We invited bids for a portion of a £15,000 budget; project bids needed to meet our evidence-based criteria and applicants were also asked to present to the IPCRG Education Sub Committee in September 2011. Following this selection process two bids were awarded. We will be working with both teams over the coming year to ensure their success and share learning with IPCRG.
