Studies have indicated that approximately one-third of patients with asthma have high SABA use (≥ 3 canisters/year) across all severities^{1,2}—a strong indicator of poor asthma control, which is associated with an increased risk of exacerbations, mortality and healthcare utilisation.¹⁻³ These consequences of an over-reliance on SABA are evident, but they are enabled by the wider healthcare framework and identification of patients who are at risk has not been straightforward.

In this symposium, we will outline how the Asthma Right Care programme has worked to develop and incorporate a series of tools that can help professionals across the healthcare spectrum to address SABA over-reliance. Presentations will also explain how such tools have been validated for use and provide a series of learnings from their implementation at a local level in Spain and the UK. Bringing this information together, the faculty will role play some situations to illustrate the ease and effectiveness of using the toolkit, before providing opportunity for an open discussion around this topic.

Para controlar un asma leve es mejor el rescate a demanda o la terapia de mantenimiento con corticoide inhalado? ¿Son similares los corticoides inhalados disponibles en la actualidad? ¿Qué es el índice terapéutico de un corticoide inhalado? ¿Debería el clínico estar más preocupado por los posibles efectos adversos sistémicos de los corticoides inhalados? Las guías de práctica clínica recomiendan escalar la dosis del corticoide inhalado elegido en caso de insuficiente control de la enfermedad; en lugar de esto, ¿deberíamos considerar un cambio a otro corticoide inhalado o tipo de dispositivo? ¿Es posible personalizar más el tratamiento de nuestros pacientes con asma? Si estas cuestiones son de tu interés, deberías asistir a esta mesa.
